Spring 2008 Environmental Workshop Series for K-12 Teachers



This workshop series provides teachers with hands-on science activities provided through Air Quality, Project Wet and Neo-Tropical Migratory Birds. *Teachers will be provided with instructional materials and curricula.* The workshops will be conducted by UNC Charlotte, Mecklenburg County Park and Recreation and USEPA staff. Teachers will receive a potential of 3.0 renewal credit and will fulfill the requirements towards NC Environmental Education.

Air Quality

Air Quality workshops are open to all interested educators including classroom teachers, environmental educators, resource agency staff, park and nature center personnel, teaching fellows, college students and faculty and youth leaders. We will discuss about air quality management and control techniques. Participants will be exposed to new technological developments in air quality monitoring and discuss recommendations on appropriate technical solutions.

Neo-Tropical Migratory Birds

Neo-Tropical migrants or neo-tropical migratory birds are those species that breed in North America and winter in Mexico, Central, and South America and the Caribbean. You know many of these as songbirds. They brighten our lives with flashes of color and beautiful song; they announce the coming of spring, after long winters. This group of birds is in trouble. In the past several years, the alarming downward population trends of many neo-tropical species has been made known. The culprits are both the loss of wintering ground habitat and habitat fragmentation on the breeding grounds. Come and learn about the neo-tropical birds, time to observe, activities for the classroom, and excellent handouts will be provided.

Project Wet

Project Wet workshops are open to all interested educators including classroom teachers, environmental educators, resource agency staff, park and nature center personnel, teaching fellows, college students and faculty, and youth leaders. At these workshops, participants engage in cooperative, hands-on learning, experiencing the activities as they are presented by skilled facilitators and their peers.
