Middle Grades Social Studies (6-9) Background Requirements

Candidates should have at least a bachelor’s degree with a major or equivalent in an area of social studies (e.g., history, geography, political science) and coursework in the competency areas below. Candidates with a major in history will satisfy any specific history deficiencies through graduate courses which may be applied to the M.A.T., but will typically satisfy other social studies deficiencies with undergraduate courses. Candidates with degrees in other fields will build to the equivalent of a 24-hour major in social studies through the undergraduate coursework below which is outside the 39-hour graduate program. The GPA for background requirements must be at least a 2.5, and no courses may be presented for licensure with grades lower than a C.
