- To be admitted to the Teachers' Education Program and take any 3000/4000 level Professional Education courses, as a minimum, students must have completed an admission application, attained a "C" or better in EDUC 2100 and SPED 2100, passed all three parts of the Praxis I test, and attained an overall GPA of at least 2.5 in at least 45 hours of course work.
- In accordance with legislation enacted in 1992 by the North Carolina General Assembly, the State Board of Governors had directed that undergraduates should enroll in at least 15 semester hours per term, thereby enabling a full-time student to complete a baccalaureate degree program in four years or the equivalent.
